
Funnyman Stephen Lynch Brings Comedy Tour to FSU's SpringFest 2010

The FSU Cultural Events Series will present funnyman Stephen Lynch as part of SpringFest 2010. Lynch, who describes himself as "a musician trapped in the body of a comedian," will host his "3 Balloons" comedy tour at the Cordts PE Center Main Arena on Saturday, May 1, at 9 p.m.

Lynch has one goal in mind: He wants to make people laugh. Constant touring and growing popularity on college campuses helped him gain a television feature for Comedy Central's live entertainment division.

In March 2009, Lynch released his fourth CD, "3 Balloons," and christened Comedy Central's new live entertainment division with a U.S. and European tour. In addition, Comedy Central will air one hour of the concert film, followed by release of a DVD.

After graduating from Western Michigan with a B.A. in drama, he



moved to New York in 1996 to become a performer. He quickly developed a devoted fan base and became a regular on the popular "Opie & Anthony" radio show. The radio exposure led Lynch to record his first special in 2000. That special became one of their highest-

rated performances, almost unheard of for an unknown. Lynch's second special debuted in January 2008, with similar high ratings.

Each of Lynch's CDs, "3 Balloons,"
"A Little Bit Special," "Superhero" and
"The Craig Machine," has sold
thousands of copies. His first DVD,
"Live at the El Rey," was certified Gold
by RIAA. Lynch has toured with some
of the biggest names in comedy. He's
also headlined his own sold-out shows
throughout the U.S. and Europe.

Rossini revised the score in 1867 for SATB solos, SATB chorus and full orchestra.

and harmonium. The vocal soloists will
be Shakira Dixon, Lauren Huyser,
Britany Poindexter and Brittany

Conklin, Adam Pomeroy and Darren
Ross (tenors); and Nathan Cook and
Matthew Purnell (bass).


