
Undergraduate Journal Publishes Mary Wolodkin's Literary Research

Branam Armiento, English Lit Alums Present Research at CEA Conference

On Saturday, March 29, Dr. Amy Branam Armiento, Milton Dawson, and William O'Boyle presented "Connecting Literature to Local History through Physical Collections: Reflections on Student Experiences in an Undergraduate Literature Course" at the College English Association's 54th annual conference.

Armiento, Dawson, O'Boyle, and Zakharova's work will be featured as a chapter in the edited collection *Students in the Archives* (University Illinois Press, 2026).

Legally Blonde The Musical takes Frostburg by Pink Storm



- 2. Once you've been approved to graduate, check your FSU email for an email inviting you to set up a login with FSU's Tassel site. After setting up your login, you can access your Tassel page any time. This is where you can access your tickets and more. This is REQUIRED to attend the ceremony.
- 3. **Order your cap and gown** through the link provided on the Tassel registration page. You can choose to ship to the University Store, Hagerstown

campus, or to your home (for a fee). Full details will be on the cap and gown ordering page.

- 4. Continue to check your FSU email for important updates and further details.

The LEAD 101 Introduction to Leadership Studies class is hosting four leaders-inresidence during their class time (2-3:15 p.m.) in 162 Gira CCIT each Thursday as the semester ends. The campus community is welcome to join any session.

 April 24 at 2 p.m.—<u>Dr. Judy Stone</u>, Infectious diseases physician and author, speaking on health advocacy leadership. Dr. Judy Stone is the daughter of Hungarian Holocaust survivors, a physician specializing in infectious diseases, and an author. She is a Forbes Pharma and Healthcare contributor, a former columnist for Scientific American, and the author of a nationally recognized textbook, Conducting Clinical Research: A Practical Guide. Dr. Stone's clinical practice and writings have been shaped by growing up as the child of survivors. Dr. Stone came to Cumberland in 1983, wanting to practice in an underserved area. She had a solo infectious disease practice until 1983 and then, practiced part-time in Pennsylvania



until 2020. Her latest book is *Resilience: One Family's Story of Hope and Triumph over Evil*, a study in human contrasts: kindness and callousness, tolerance and hatred, humanity and cruelty.

May 1 at 2 p.m.—John Adams
(Communication Studies alumnus, 2012),
Director of Safety, KCI Technologies,
speaking on safety leadership. Mr. John
Adams graduated from FSU with a Bachelor
of Science in Communication Studies, with a
focus on Interpersonal and Organizational
Communication. After graduating, he entered
into the Civil and Environmental Engineering
industry utilizing his previous work-related
experience of hazardous materials and
started working as an Industrial Hygiene
Technician in 2014. Mr. Adams has worked
for KCI Technologies, Inc. since 2017 and



progressed to becoming a Senior Scientist and Project Manager where he consulted on Occupational Safety for his clients, some of which include The Smithsonian Institute, the Army Corps of Engineers, the Maryland Port Administration, The Johns Hopkins Hospital System, and the Architect of the Capitol in Washington DC. In 2024, Mr. Adams stepped away from his role as a consultant for KCl's clients and was appointed as the Director of Safety. In this role, he manages the safety program for KCl's 80+ offices and over 2,700 employees across the country. He is responsible for driving a culture of safety consciousness for his fellow Employee Owners and advising KCl's leadership on trends in occupational safety. Currently, Mr. Adams is an active member of the American Society of Safety Professionals' Chesapeake Chapter and is a Board-Certified Safety Professional (CSP).

May 8 at 2 p.m.—Lillia Rose, Legislative Assistant, Delegate Vogel, (Maryland), speaking on political leadership. Ms. Lillia Rose earned her Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from American University's School of Public Affairs, where she focused on applied political writing, legislative research, and campaign strategy. Her experience spans local, state, and federal government, including serving as a Legislative Assistant and Staff Correspondent in the Maryland General Assembly for Delegate Joe Vogel, and interning in the Office of Congressman David Trone (MD-06). She also served as Digital Specialist for the April Delaney for Congress campaign,

where she managed digital outreach and served as liaison to Garrett County. A passionate advocate for civic engagement and rural Appalachian representation, Ms. Rose is the founder of the Mountain Maryland Young Democrats and a member of the Garrett County Democratic Central Committee. In 2024, she was a Delegate to the Democratic National Convention, representing Western Maryland on the national stage. Ms. Rose also serves on the Board of the Garrett County Historical Society and previously co-coordinated the Autumn Glory Festival and Maryland State



Banjo and Fiddle Tournament, while managing media and outreach for the Town of Oakland. In addition to her civilian work, Ms. Rose is a Psychological Operations Sergeant (37F) in the U.S. Army Reserve, currently assigned to the 11th Psychological Operations Battalion. She completed advanced training at the JFK School of Special Warfare and supports her unit as the Public Affairs Representative.



Dr. Lawrence Weill Pens New Novel

Book Launch Scheduled for April 29 at Ort Library at 4 p.m.

Dr. Lawrence Weill, interim provost and vice president for the Division of Student Success at FSU, is also an award-winning author and. His latest novel is "The Metaphysics Shoppe of Wyler's Ford."

While at The Metaphysics Shoppe, you might find a book on the I Ching, learn your future through a laying of the cards, or grab an herbal tea to soothe your spirit. Or find out who you really are. When Rex and Sylvie decide to realize their dream and start a fortune-telling shop in the small town of Kentucky, they discover what it is they are leaving and face dangers from their past. Ultimately, they must learn what they are seeking. And in learning what they seek, they can answer the ontological questions they actually have.



"The Metaphysics Shoppe of Wyler's Ford" is witty literary fiction with a healthy dose of magical realism and is the third book in the Wyler's Ford series.

Weill writes novels, short fiction, non-fiction articles and books, creative non-fiction and poetry. He has nine books in print, including his latest novel, "The Metaphysics Shoppe of Wyler's Ford." His work has appeared in a wide range of local, regional

and national journals. He is also a visual artist working in graphite, oils, metal and wood. In addition to his life as a writer and visual artist, Weill works in academia, beginning as a professor of philosophy and ethics for nearly 25 years, then as an academic administrator.

When he is not in Maryland, Weill lives in the woods overlooking a beaver pond next to a wildlife preserve. He is also an avid outdoorsman and gardener.

programs, discussions and hands-on activities highlighting issues of sustainability and climate awareness. All presentations are open to the campus community and the larger regional community.






PA Program On-Campus PAID Opportunity

On Friday, April 25, the PA Program will be on the main campus at the Education and Health Sciences building for a simulation assessment. They are recruiting FSU faculty, staff, or students who are interested in being patient actors for PA students during the simulation. No prior experience is necessary, and participants will be

provided with a brief, virtual training session in advance of Friday's session. Patient actors, called "standardized patients" play a vital role in helping healthcare learners practice their clinical and communication skills in a controlled, supportive environment. The pay is \$25/hour.
