We are proud to share with the campus community that the **Nowaczyk Family** has generously made a contribution to endow the Centre, which will include a naming opportunity. Consistent with established USM guidelines, the proposed name is subject to the approval of the Board of Regents.



FSU Joins Maryland Transfer Intensive

FSU joined the inaugural cohort of the new [Maryland Statewide Transfer Intensive](#), a project designed to significantly improve community college transfer outcomes. Over the next several years, FSU will work alongside Allegany College of Maryland and our other regional community college partners to develop a comprehensive transfer ecosystem to increase transfer enrollments; improve transfer advising support; develop new strategies and programs that make transferring simpler, more equitable and more effective; prioritize transfer student outcomes and graduation rates; and improve data tracking and institutional practices related to transfer student success.

New Partnerships, Expanded Programs

Two of FSU's newest partnerships include the [Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine \(LECOM\)](#) agreement to facilitate the admission of qualified students into one of LECOM's professional schools and the [Meritus School of Osteopathic Medicine \(MSOM\)](#) agreement that guarantees a formal interview opportunity for eligible students upon the successful completion of academic requirements to create a structured pathway for them to pursue a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree. These partnerships not only affirm the exceptional preparation our students receive at FSU but also provides them with clear and supportive pathways to pursue their dreams.

Plan to Renovate Brownsville Approved by USM

Renovations to the [Brownsville residence hall](#) will begin soon, and we remain optimistic that our students returning in fall of 2026 will be able to enjoy this vibrant and modern environment. Equally important, these updates reflect our continued commitment to strengthening our campus infrastructure and enhancing the student experience. New furniture has been ordered, and existing furnishings are being carefully assessed for relocation to other areas across campus where they are most needed.



Launch of the FSU Strategic Investment Fund

FSU launched its new Strategic Investment Fund designed to support innovative, high-impact activities and projects that advance FSU's institutional mission, strategic priorities and long-term sustainability. This competitive internal funding opportunity aims to empower departments, faculty and staff to pursue bold ideas that promote academic excellence, student success, community engagement and financial stability. Ultimately, the launch of this fund will strengthen the University's foundation for future growth and academic innovation, positioning us to respond boldly to emerging needs and opportunities.

Sustained Commitment to Research and Innovation

FSU continues to demonstrate strong leadership through faculty scholarship and externally-funded research. External grant funding is a major funding source for driving innovation and high-impact research at FSU.

In FY 25, members of the FSU community submitted a record number of 97 grant proposals secured over \$4.4 million in grant awards! One grant award in particular was a prestigious 3-year, \$400,000 [National Science Foundation \(NSF\) research grant](#), which will support the launch of the Appalachian Innovation Institute.



I hope you have enjoyed reading our Top 10 List from last year. These highlights represent just a sampling - not an exhaustive account - of the meaningful progress made across the University. As you can see, each of these achievements is a testament to the resilience, dedication and vision of our faculty, staff, students, alumni and community partners.
