The one feeling that we should not allow to continue is a fear for one's safety. Please be assured the university will not tolerate physical or verbal attacks on others. I ask us all to respect each other and engage in meaningful dialogue to learn from each other. On a personal note, I was a student during a time of change and uncertainty, the Vietnam era, including the time of the Kent State shootings. I was fortunate to be at a university that allowed and encouraged us, as students, to talk about our feelings and concerns in meaningful ways. Now, as a President, I ask you to join me, the administration and the faculty to help create those conversations on campus. I will share that the use of chalk and spray-painted graffiti on campus is not creating that venue and is not helping us move forward.

We talk about Frostburg State University being "A World of Experiences" with an emphasis on the experience part. What I have valued very much in my time at Frostburg State is that this is a campus of "doers." I am up to helping each of you use this time as an opportunity to find avenues for healthy discussion and understanding of the various emotions being expressed across our campus. Are you willing to work with me to accomplish that? As the next generation of leaders in this country and the world, can you help me create those avenues for healthy and productive discussion? I can tell you that my time as an undergraduate during very uncertain times shaped my life in many ways. I want to return that favor to you by making this time one that helps you for the future.

I am off campus today and tomorrow. On Sunday, I invite anyone in the campus community, especially students, who have ideas and want to talk about them to meet with me in the Atkinson Room in the Lane Center between 1 and 3. I look forwarding to seeing you there.
