I've talked with Dave Rose about this and plan to have discussions on how best to budget funds in the future that reflect our planning objectives.
- 3. <u>Enrollment Goals.</u> Enrollment continues to be the lifeblood of this institution. I had a very fruitful meeting with the Enrollment Management Committee, and several ideas were exchanged that need further discussion. I plan to meet with various leadership groups in early spring to have focused discussions on recruitment and student retention. Both contribute to our

strategic enrollment as well as the perception of the value of the Frostburg State University degree. Obviously, enrollment is related to budget as well.

Lastly, this is my last email update prior to the beginning of final exams. I wish everyone success as the semester draws to a close.
