E. Amendment to Update Graduate Council Charter

Proposal to update/amend the charter of the Graduate Council to include a representative from the new interdisciplinary Master of Environmental Management (MEM) in Sustainability program – This amendment updates the number of Faculty Representatives in GC from 14 to 15. (This is also referenced in the Word document, above)

Additional Updates:

- A. The evaluation of administrators and "morale" (involvement) survey have been combined and will be distributed soon.
- B. A separate survey will be sent out shortly after spring break asking faculty of all categories to share their thoughts on our current evaluation system.
- C. DEI work continues. I shared, with Senate Steering, a new UMBC policy as it relates to DEI and its use in promotion and tenure decisions. The main point is that UMBC is going to "acknowledge and reward" DEI involvement by faculty (as opposed to punishing lack of involvement).

Division of University Advancement Report to University Advisory Council March 10, 2023

- We had an extremely successful Giving Day
 - o 2,122 donors versus 1,225 last year
 - o \$167,969 raised versus \$145,305 last year
 - \$26,670 was donated by members of the FSU Foundation Board of Directors for challenges, including \$10,000 to the Swimming Team for having the most donors and \$5,000 to Men's Lacrosse for the second most donors
- We have now raised over \$22 million towards our campaign goal of \$25 million
- Recent new hires in the Division include
 - Mia Cross as Director of Communications
 - Formerly the Public Information Specialist for the Allegany County Public Schools
 - o Colby Ellsworth as the Director of Web & Digital Strategy
 - Formerly the Senior Website Designer and Developer for Willetts Tech/Little Dog Social Media
- As part of the celebration of FSU's 125th anniversary this year we have partnered with Publishing Concepts to obtain stories from our alumni about their time at FSU and thereafter. To date we have obtained 1,587 stories.
- Our major celebration of the 125th anniversary will take place on May 5th and 6th in conjunction with Alumni Weekend and the Student Spring Fling. Attached is a tentative schedule of events.
