

**M.Ed Regional Advisory Meeting with Stakeholder/Partners
October 19, 2022**

The meeting began at 9:05.

Introduction:

George Brown started with Welcome and Introductions. Doris Santamaria-Makang gave Introductions from the Department of Educational Professions. Dr. Santamaria-Makang shared that FSU Educational Professions is in the final approvals of the Elementary/Special Education program. Kim Rotruck gave Welcome from the Office of the Dean.

Doctoral Student Project (FSU Alumni Teaching in LEA Partner Schools:

Janet Mattern introduced the Doctoral Students and the work for Component R4.1 for the CAEP Accreditation and Maryland Assessment Competencies (Identifying Graduates of FSU teaching in the school systems/effectiveness). Stacey Williams and Latisha Cooper presented the work completed thus far and possible changes within the ED.D. (case study over two semester). A focus in WCPS because there is 1)most graduates and 2) identified SLO. There is a meeting with Gary Willows (Elementary Supervisor) to further work on data collection. Discussion from partner school system attendees indicated that both FCPS and WCPS have public access to teachers' collegiate records. Discussion concerning IRB and possible site (Bester Elementary in WCPS). Troy Keller shared board documents that demonstrated how FCPS publishes teacher education data at the time of hire.

Program Assessment Data:

Jen Delaney presented an overview concerning data on Program Assessment and the possible inclusion of disposition data collection. Dr. Brown shared that there were revisions to all Program Assessment Key Assessments. Jamey Tobery-Nystrom presented specific examples of the revisions and the Spring pilot data analysis for EDUC 606 and CUIN 654.

Elementary/Special Education:

Drs. Brown and Nystrom shared an update on the M.Ed. Special Education suspension as a stand-alone concentration. Dr. Brown shared that the Special Education courses would be housed in the C & I program. Dr. Brown shared with the group that the main issue was that the Special Education concentration was that it was an advanced program that used initial standards. Dr. Nystrom shared that the vision for the Special Education concentration in C & I would be to prepare for Case Management in Special Education and would use the Council for Exception Children's' Advanced Standards. Dr.

Nystrom shared that a long term goal would be to add a certificate for Special Education Case Management.

A discussion about adding other certificate programs ensued. Annie Anders asked about the possibility of bringing a Library/Media and Instructional Technology. We will be looking into that opportunity. Jenna Epstein shared that the School Counseling concentration will have a PPW certificate.

The regular meeting adjourned at 10:18 and concentrations moved into specific meetings.
