This agreement is effective with Prince George's Community College admits 2019-2020.

This agreement will be reviewed every two years

Advising sessions (group and individual) will be held every semester. All information related to registration, including course offerings and schedules of classes, will be made available at the community college site or via the Web for students enrolled at Frostburg State University. This will be by phone, email, or synchronous class as per the student's choice.

Any synchronous classes will be scheduled to accommodate the working adult while in an Associate Degree in Nursing Program. The student will receive dual advising from Prince George's Community College and Frostburg State University faculty to guide the student in completing appropriate prerequisites and selecting their RN-BSN core courses.

Student records will be maintained at Prince George's Community College and will be made accessible to faculty and staff at Frostburg State University with written student permission on an as-needed basis.

Tuition and fees assessed will be that of Frostburg State University for all RN-BSN program core courses.

Students are eligible to apply for departmental scholarships and institutional scholarships, as they will be students at both schools in the event the student decides to attend Frostburg State University RN-BSN classes while pursuing their Associate Degree in Nursing at Prince George's Community College.

Students can take any nursing course while pursuing their Associate Degree in Nursing provided they have completed all appropriate prerequisites as outlined in the Frostburg State University undergraduate catalog. (A four credit chemistry course with a lab must be completed prior to admission or during the first semester of nursing classes.)

All new students enrolled in Frostburg's RN to BSN Program are required to take a zero credit, pass/fail orientation course during their first semester of the Nursing Program. The purpose of this course is to help new students learn more about the program, become acclimated to the online learning environment at Frostburg, and to help students become aware of all the different types of resources and support services available to them. The main topics of the course include Technology, Library Services, Being a Successful Online Student, Advising, RN-BSN e-Portfolio, and the Community Health Practicum. This orientation course is six weeks in length and starts one week before the semester begins.

Listed is a description of the current Prince George's Community College ASN programmatic and degree requirements. (Note: Students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average in order to transfer.)

Minimum Required Credits for Graduation from Frostburg

120 credits*

* Minimum 120 credits needed for graduation; additional transfer credits, depending on student's academic history, may be required. FSU RN-BSN/ATB Coordinator will provide each student with a detailed Academic Plan of Study.

Overview and Summary

For students following this agreement, the steps are as follows:

Step 1: Complete the Associate Degree in Nursing at Prince George's Community College.

Step 2: Apply for admission to Frostburg State University, indicating RN-BSN Program as the intended major. Applications for admission can be obtained by visiting the website:

**If PSC 250 Human Growth & Development and BIO 202 Microbiology are taken at Prince George's Community College, they will fulfill the Colloquia Requirement. If not taken at Prince George's Community College, any liberal arts electives taken at Prince George's Community College that are GEP, such as Speech and Computer Science, will meet the requirement.

- Those courses highlighted are required for the CC/MGW Nursing Program.
- General Education Program may be different if the student is a re-entry to FSU or it is a second degree.
- Minimum 120 credits needed for graduation from Frostburg's Nursing Program.
