"The SVA National Conference (NATCON) is the largest gathering of student veterans anywhere in the world. With SVA chapters at over 1,500 campuses across the U.S. and in several countries abroad, NATCON serves as a focal point in the academic year to share ideas, best practices, and network with student veterans, military-connected students, their families, supporters, and allies, as well as corporate, government, and nonprofit partners, and more" (SVA Headquarters). Our students were able to gain skills thru workshops within the three days of the conference, meet other students going thru their same experiences, network with chapter leaders, and sell themselves for possible jobs at the SVA Campus Career Fair with over 300 employers ready to provide opportunities for our students whether in internships or jobs when they graduate. From January $5^{\rm th}-7^{\rm th}, 2022,$ our students' schedules were packed from 7 AM until 10 PM each day, taking in all opportunities that presented themselves to help their futures.

"The SVA Conference was such a pleasant experience. I participated as a speaker, and through that experience, I developed my public speaking and interpersonal skills. Throughout the conference, there were several sessions filled with valuable information—specifically, the LinkedIn for Veterans seminar. On November 15th, 2022, the Veterans Center held a room dedication ceremony to honor First Lieutenant Harold D. Martin. The FSU Class of '66 launched a campaign and raised an additional \$13,000 to dedicate and name a room in Martin's memory. The Class of '66 demonstrated their unending togetherness as a way to honor their fallen classmate.

First Lieutenant Harold D. Martin, a member of Company B, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces and was assigned for duty in Vietnam to advise and assist the Vietnamese people in their struggle for freedom. On October 23rd, 1968, he was very seriously wounded when his unit engaged a hostile force in a firefight while conducting a search and clear mission. He expired from his wounds later the same day in the 8th Field Hospital. First Lieutenant Martin was a highly respected and dedicated member whose contributions to justice and freedom serve as an inspiration to all who knew him.
