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Supporting Students During Covid-19

The COVID pandemic created unprecedented circumstances to our world. It forced us in TRIO -SSS to change how we provide services to students. We went from having only in person meeting options and relying heavily on paper to needing to figure out how to meet our students' needs during these challenging times. The SSS mission became to provide the same level of support and services, just implemented differently. As Fall 2020 came upon us we supported our students by being on-campus, in our offices, and offering both in-person and virtual appointments. It was challenging as we moved furniture to maintain proper social distancing, learned new technology, wore masks, wiped desks, and sanitized pens and other materials. Being flexible in meeting students' needs is an important component of the success of the SSS program, and students consistently commented how much they appreciated being able to meet in our offices and virtually depending on their needs. Throughout the academic year, these positive comments provided the incentive to continue and reinforced that we were doing something right.

Participants were expected to be fully engaged with the program, despite the pandemic. All services were still offered, with the exception of cultural trips, and events that couldn't be safely accommodated in person were offered in a virtual format. In addition to

meeting with students individually, we were able to hold our end of semester graduate receptions virtually, we live-streamed workshops, and found ways to participate in virtual and in-person leadership opportunities. It was not an easy feat, but we were able to take a monumental challenge to learn, grow, and change how we approach student support. While most services and events will return to a face to face format in the fall, students will still have the option to schedule virtual appointments. At the end of the year, 86.2% of our survey respondents said they prefer to meet with their SSS advisor in person or both online and in person. The Covid-19 pandemic forced us to evaluate and adapt policies and procedures, some of which created long term changes that will improve the program in the future.
