7. Graduated from college with a degree in music and later in 1962 with a theology degree.
8. In 1954 his first television show was called "The Children's Hour" aired on the WQED, a public television station in Pittsburgh.
9. Until 1981 his mother made his sweater once a month and today one is in the Smithsonian.
10. Received the Presidential Medal of Freedom and inducted into the Television Hall of Fame.
11. His television show "Mr. Roger's Neighborhood" devoted to the young child aired on public television for 31 seasons.
