1. Major General Armistead commissioned the making of this American Symbol.
2. She learned the trade from her widowed mother who made blankets and uniforms
3. Women were the only employees in this fabric shop which was very unusual during this time period.
4. Her first name rhymes with berry
5. While on a British Ship Francis Scott Key wrote a poem honoring this symbol.
6. It took this seamstress, her thirteen-year-old daughter, two nieces, her mother, and an indentured servant six weeks to make this symbol.
7. Her last name contains the name of the part of a fish that allows it to breath.
8. This seamstress lived and made the flag in 844 East Pratt Street in Baltimore, Maryland.
9. The flag she made flew over Fort McHenry in 1813 when America was at war with the British.
10. The flag contained fifteen stripes and fifteen stars and is displayed in the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History.
