Description of Site:

Department of Juvenile Services has 4 youth centers throughout Allegany and Garrett County. We are a residential program that treats male clients between the ages of 13-18. These males are court ordered to our placement due to legal entanglements. The majority of youth that are in our programs are suffering from both mental health and substance abuse issues. While interning you would have the opportunity to participate in individual, group and family counseling. There are 40 clients at each center who receive all services. The services are provided mainly Monday through Friday however because we are open 7 days a week 24 hours a day, following the interns initial training they could work a very flexible schedule which best meets their needs.

Description of Site:

The Family Crisis Resource Center is an outpatient clinic and emergency shelter located in Cumberland, MD. FCRC is a non-profit agency that provides direct services to survivors of domestic violence, intimate partner violence, rape, incest, sexual assault, sexual abuse, and stalking. Services are also offered to family members of the survivor, such as children, extended family members, and other household members. The Family Crisis Resource Center offers an array of services including individual and group counseling, an emergency shelter, crisis management, case management, advocacy and accompaniment, a sexual assault response team, domestic violence follow-ups, and supervised visitation and exchange. The agency also provides group services to perpetrators of sexual violence and domestic abuse. Perpetrators participate in a 15-week psychoeducation abuse intervention program.

The Garrett County Center for Behavioral Health is an outpatient facility that provides outpatient mental health and addiction services to a wide variety of clients. Services are provided at our clinic locations and throughout the community.

Our Mental Health component includes children and adult services, trauma services, crisis intervention, jail based services, co-occurring services and geriatric outreach services. Our children's services are provided at all Head Start locations, each elementary, middle and high school and the clinic. We have approximately 900 active mental health consumers.

Our Addiction component also provides services to children and adults. We provide both early intervention and treatment services to adolescents. Our adult services provide DUI/DWI education, outpatient addiction services, intensive outpatient addiction services and jail based services. A significant amount of our addiction work is accomplished through groups. In addition we provide liaison services to the court and provide pre-court assessments for individuals requiring it. We have approximately 200 active substance abuse consumers.

The Joseph S. Massie Unit is a 25 bed, intensive treatment facility for adults experiencing the devastating effects of alcoholism and other chemical dependencies. The unit applies a holistic treatment approach that addresses the issues necessary to develop an abstinent lifestyle. The Massie Unit is licensed by the State of Maryland and certified by the Alcohol and Drug Abuse

Administration as a residential drug-free treatment program. It is a program of the Allegany County Health Department and is located in the Thomas B. Finan Center. The Massie Unit is staffed by a multidisciplinary team of professionals, including Addictions Counselors, Nurses, a Recreational Therapist, a Physician, and a Nutritionist. Care is provided 24-hours a day, 7 days a week. A belief that recovery requires a personal, professional, and a community commitment is inherent to the program's activities, which include individual and group therapies, psychoeducation and self-help groups. Aftercare Coordination is an integral part of the program geared to developing an individualized plan for continued recovery upon discharge.

Description provided by the site:

This is a maximum security male institution that houses approximately 1500 inmates. NBCI is one of the most technologically sound and most secure prisons in the world, as depicted on shows broadcasted by National Geographic and The Discovery Channel. As deinstitutionalization occurred over the past decades, many mentally ill people ended up in prisons. We operate two programs to include the Special Needs Unit (SNU), designed for inmates with severe mental illness, and the Behavior Management Program (BMP) for inmates with severe behavior problems. There is a high percentage of mentally ill inmates housed at NBCI to include a very diverse array of diagnoses not seen in many other mental health settings.

The Psychology Department at NBCI is staffed by five professionals and to include doctoral and master's level psychology associates and LCPC's. We provide services to include individual therapy, group therapy, crisis intervention, suicidal risk assessment and prevention, psychological testing and assessment, throughout diagnostic assessment, detailed documentation, frequent peer review sessions, behavior modification and interdisciplinary team approaches. This list is not inclusive of the many other duties involved in being a correctional professional.

2. To provide individual therapy and counseling to people of all ages utilizing diversified professional techniques.
3. To provide group, marital and family therapy according to training.
4. To establish with the client within the first two appointments a written goal specific treatment plan.
5. To provide professional mental health consultation to other program areas and community individuals or agencies on assigned clients.
6. To document provided service with client assessments, up-to-date clinical notes and other related client and agency documentation.
7. Clinical hours will be from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday. Additional late hours will be offered as needed.

8. Will cooperate with crisis staff in arranging voluntary hospitalizations (when available) for assigned clients to aid in making as smooth a transition as possible from community to inpatient.
 - a. If in a scheduled appointment with the client, we will work with crisis staff but also try to work directly with the client as much as possible in arranging the admission.
 - b. If out of the office or scheduled for other appointments, a request may be made for the crisis staff to implement a voluntary admission without our involvement.
 - c. All voluntary admissions will be accomplished by the crisis staff during working hours. Clinical staff assigned to any specific case will be consulted when available, if they are not already aware of the situation.
9. Responsibilities at the Long Term Structured Residence include all of the above but also includes participation in weekly treatment team meetings; coordination of care with other service providers as well as family members; the development and provision of group therapy; discharge planning and other related tasks involved in providing quality care for the SMI population.

Description provided by site:

The Clinical Services Unit (CSU) provides outpatient therapeutic services for children and adults who are experiencing significant anxiety, depression, relationship problems and other emotional distress. Therapy is provided to enhance and promote developmental potential, personal growth and problem solving capabilities of the consumer. The Clinical Services Unit provides psychological and psychiatric evaluations. In addition to psychiatric evaluations, on-going psychiatric appointments for medication management are also available. (The CSU services children, adolescents, adults, individuals and families.)

Group Counseling Center (GCC) and Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP) offer day treatment for adults experiencing emotional problems that interfere with their daily living. The programs offer a variety of therapeutic, educational, recreational and supportive groups that deal with issues such as abuse, alcoholism, depression, coping with loss, family dysfunctions, self-esteem, interpersonal relationships, and effectively managing your mental wellness. Treatment is based on an individual approach under the direction of a psychiatric physician. (The GCC/PHP services adults age 18 and over in a group setting.)

Long Term Structured Residence (LTSR) is a highly structured therapeutic residential mental health treatment facility designed to serve consumers 18 years of age or older. The LTSR provides alternative treatment to consumers at risk of hospitalization. Community integration is built into programming at every available opportunity. (The LTSR services adults age 18 and over in a residential setting.)
