130	THEREFORE B	BE IT RESOLVED THAT:	
140		Senators that fail to meet the cumulative grade point average of 2.5 shall submit an	
150		appeal to remain on SGA. This appeal is open to senators of any class rank and	
160		transfer students and that are not on academic probation. Additionally, if a student	
170		fails to demonstrate academic growth, measured by their grade point average	
180		during the semester of their appeal, they shall be dismissed from office. This is a	
190		one-time process.

210	THEREFORE I	T BE FURTHER RESOLVED:	
220		Senators that fail to meet the cumulative grade point average of 2.5 shall submit an	
230		appeal that includes the following: a letter, written or typed, by the senator	
240		describing the circumstances that led to the decline of their grade point average and	
250		their plans for improvement; a letter of recommendation from one professor, or	
260		high school teacher or counselor; a letter from a professor, doctor,	
270		therapist/counselor, academic advisor, or other professional entity that may vouch	
280		for the circumstances a senator has outlined that resulted in the decline of their	
290		grade point average. This criteria will be reviewed and outcomes will be decided by	
300		the SGA President, Vice-President, and advisors.

320	ADDITION TO	THE CONSTITUTION: ARTICLE VI SECTION C SUBSECTION 1:	
330		All senators shall maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average	
340		throughout the term of service. Failure to maintain such an average shall result in	
350		automatic dismissal from office, with the following exception: a. An incoming or	
360		current senator of any class rank or transfer student and is not on academic	
370		probation, that wishes to appeal the cumulative grade point average requirement. i.	
380		To appeal the cumulative grade point average requirement, an incoming or current	

390	senator must provide a letter outlining the circumstances that led to their inability
400	to meet the minimum cumulative grade point average, as well as a letter from a
410	professor, doctor, therapist/counselor, academic advisor, or other professional
420	entity that can verify the integrity of the senator's letter of circumstance, and lastly,
430	a letter of recommendation from one professor or high school teacher or counselor.
